

Protect the Park at the Heart of Our Water Supply

The Sunshine Coast Regional District wants to push forward with the Chapman Lake Water Supply Expansion Project. If implemented, this plan would seriously impact the sensitive ecosystem surrounding the lake and will not solve any long term water supply issues. The Sunshine Coast Conservation Association is fundamentally opposed to this project.

Here are our reasons why:



Water Supply

- The Sunshine Coast has major, long-term water supply issues, which will not be resolved by increasing the draw down on Chapman Lake.
- The project has the potential to degrade our most important water source area, Chapman Lake in Tetrahedron Provincial Park.

Financial Responsibility

- Spending up to \$24,000,000 and not getting a sustainable secondary supply of water is just wrong.
- The SCRDR has already purchased a siphon system (\$154,398) for Chapman Lake and has yet to use this alternative.

Protecting Our Park, Water Supply and Wildlife

- Tetrahedron Provincial Park has Class A protected status and is the pristine source area of water for most Sunshine Coast residents. We need to keep this source area pristine!
- Species at risk, fish habitat and sensitive ecosystems would be impacted by more than doubling the draw down.
- BC Parks has not approved the project.

The 1st step to help steer the SCRDR in the right direction is for you to **sign the SCRDR's Alternate Approval Process (AAP) *Elector Response Form***. Enough people saying NO will stop the SCRDR from borrowing the initial \$5,000,000 for the project and **give the SCRDR time to have a real conversation with the community about the Sunshine Coast's long term water supply needs.**
